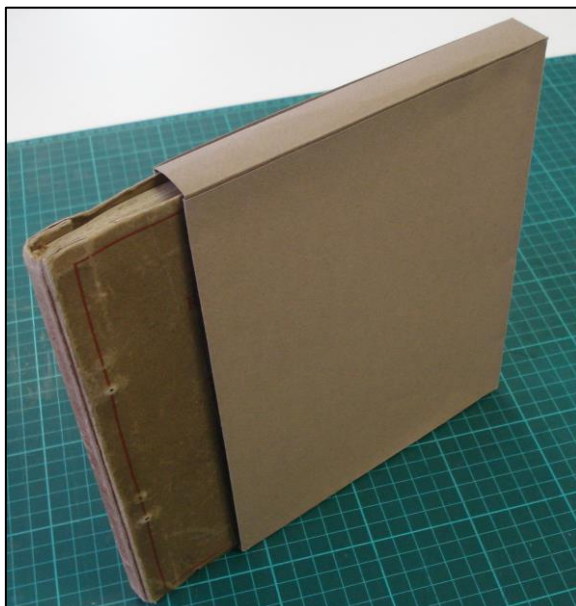


Expanding Slipcase for Paper Bindings

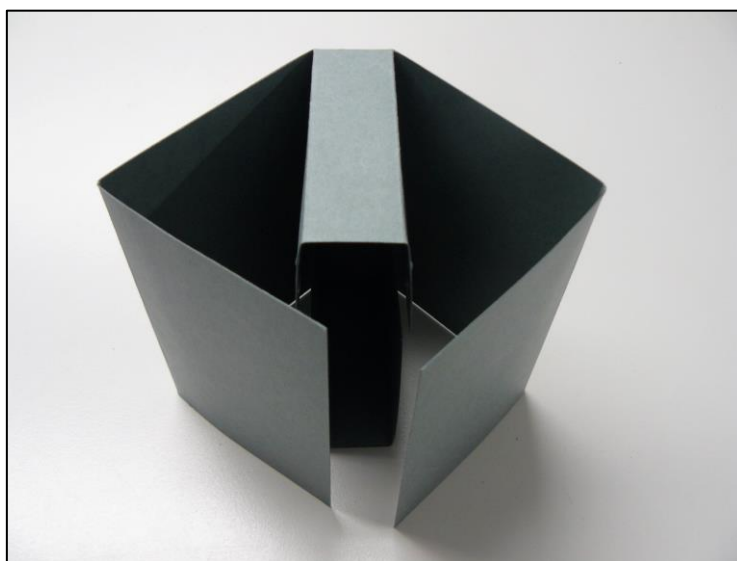
Purpose: The Expanding Slipcase is intended for safer storage and handling of paper covered bindings that usually sit unprotected on the shelf. This enclosure is only suitable for light weight bindings. The slipcase also stabilising paper bindings that fall easily on a shelf.

Materials: By constructing the slipcase from light weight archival quality paper such as archival manilla or Kraft, this type of enclosure takes up very little shelf space. The final weight paper depends on the size and weight of the binding. Also, using an archival paper that is a similar colour to the cover results in a more sympathetic enclosure.

Method: Measure out, cut and crease the selected slipcase material according to the diagram – see other downloadable file. Slipcase is constructed by turning in the head and tail flaps, which are locked into place by the folded left and right flaps.

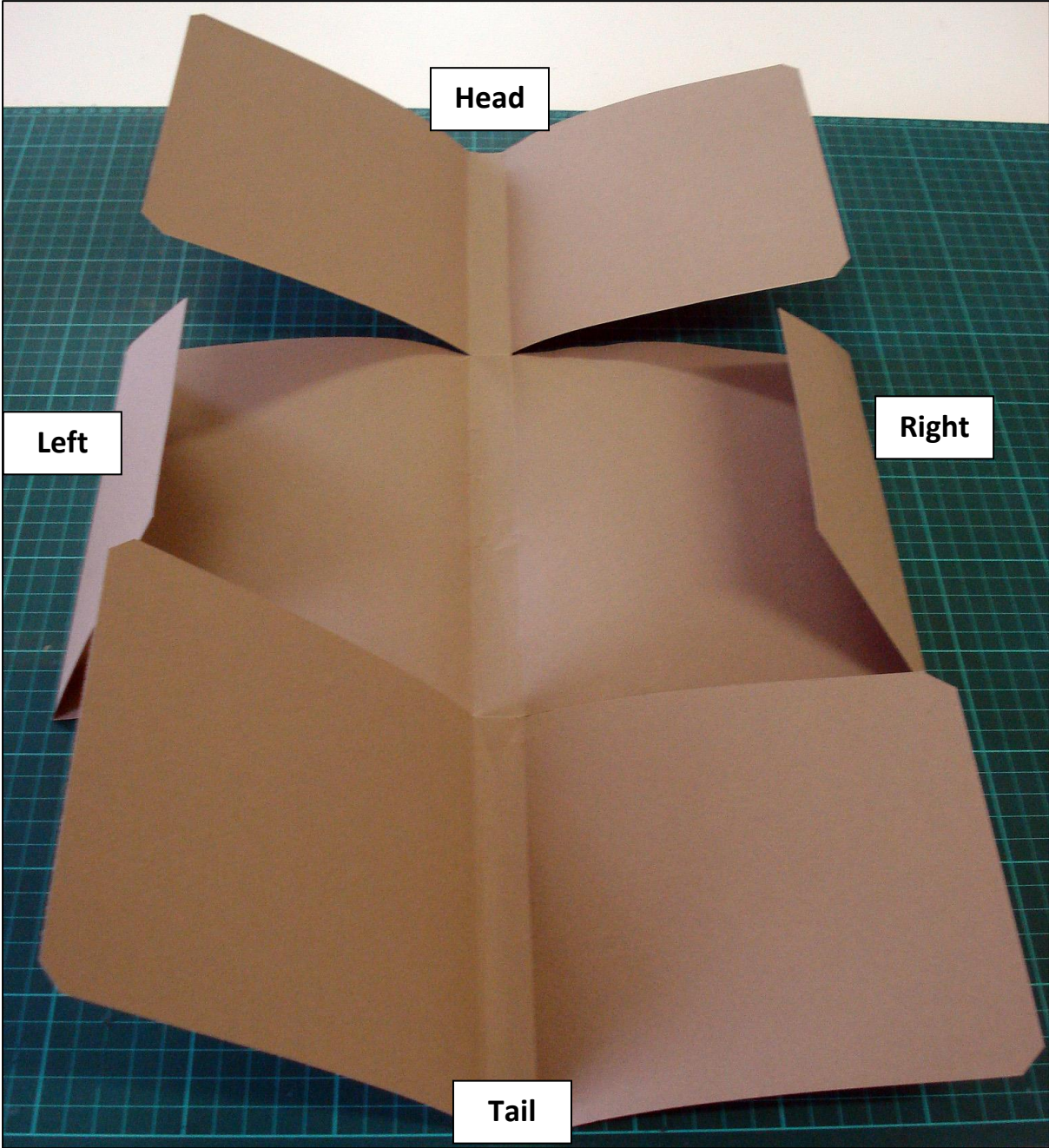


Completed slipcase housing a paper covered binding
